Director & Designer

For Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat, I served as Director, as well as designed the set, costumes, props, and lighting. Many hours of work went into creating the whimsical design, including completely handmade costumes and hand made set pieces. The "wash of color" design was inspired by two of my favorite children's books: Chicka Chicka Boom Boom and The Very Hungry Caterpillar.

Special attention was paid to make an adult show accessible to young performers. Giving them a vibrant world to play in helped do just that.

For this project, in addition to serving as director, I wrote an original script for my second graders inspired by the Percy Jackson series for their Greek performance. I also designed the costumes. While St. Mark's performs a Greek show every year, I took the opportunity to meet my students where they were: already big fans of Percy Jackson, I created a new show to supplement their interests and further their learning and investment. Designing an original show was so much fun -- it could be anything I imagined, but it had to withstand the outdoors AND potentially move indoors at a moment's notice due to weather!










ZION KING

Through a combination of projections and practical effects, such as handmade animal masks and shadow puppets, the savannah came to life onstage.

REALLY REALLY


Director

One of my proudest projects to date, I partnered with colleagues to mount a production of Paul Downs Colaizzo's Really Really. We had no budget and no theatre space to perform in, but we were determined to have this story heard. I purchased the rights myself and we rehearsed and blocked the production in a friend's house nearby. It was exciting and challenging to create a site-specific piece of theatre, particularly in creating separate, distinct spaces. For the performances, audience members crowded into the rooms of the house and became a part of the intense, personal story. All ticket sales were donated to our local YWCA.

Another big part of me as a director is the world of writing and devising my own work to be translated to the stage. I have always felt that there were stories inside me, waiting to be told. The creative process becomes more thrilling and fulfilling for me when starting a story and bringing it to fruition with a final performance. The actors each received a full page-long script of dialogue to give them an understanding of their character and subtext, though only 4 lines were spoken allowed for the audience.












Writer & Director
